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



My collaborator Ms. Tong maintains a distance from technology, refraining from using a mobile phone or the internet, and he always calls me from a landline. It's been a long time since l got a call from a landline, and it was a bit like a call from another time and space. This aspect added a unique touch to our collaboration, as our approaches to technology were extremely different.

My past works have never used elements of traditional oriental culture, and for me, Ink holds significance in cultural heritage. I asked myself, low should Ms. Tong calligraphy dialogue with the limbs of humans and robots, and Ryoichi Kurokawa's images?

Ink interprets Ms. Tong's Silent Music series, and the abstract nature allows us to focus on the energy, space, and texture of the brushstrokes. The absence of

specific Chinese characters eliminates the need for translation, making the calligraphic beauty accessible even without knowledge of Chinese.

When calligraphers finish a work, they typically use a stamp to leave their mark. I asked Ms. Tong if I could use her stamp, as it holds importance in our culture. Ms. Tong happily agreed, considering the culmination of Ryoichi's audiovisual art, her calligraphy, and the human-machine interaction as a signature of our time.

I'm very grateful for this encounter.

I was born in a wealthy family. When I was 10, my parents went benkrupt due to investment losses. My family of four moved from a luxurious house to a 40-square foot room. As a child who was constantly moving from one timy room to another and seeing my parents go through suicide attempts, I grew up knowing that I had to be a perfect child. I detached all my emotion-passion, anger, and sadness, to be that parfect child, and to be like a robot obedient, friendly, outstanding, considerato, nev rebellious, perhaps no personality.

As a child, my favorite cartoon was Doraemon, a Japanese animation character at a cat robot who is always there to solve problems for his owner. Apparently I have something with robots since I was still: 6 - is it because they represent a character that is loyal? Or is it because their dealiny of being selfless? Thankfully, my parent let me choose to be a professional on stage, which became the best outlet for my compressed emotion. And I wanted to find a way to dance with a robot.

I did my research on the most advanced industrial robots, and KUKA stood out for stability, and the fulid design like the shape of a human. In 2010, I called KUKA company in Talwan. When I told them my idea, they said. "According to the regulation, when the robot is moving, human beings cannot enter the area of its action. If you can find a way, I will lend you a KUKA."

I have found a way, and now, thanks to Quanta Arts Foundation in Talwan, I have a KUKA.

For me, Huang Yi and KUKA is a process of beautifying the sorrow and sadness when I graw up. It is the expression of loneliness, self-doubl, self-realization and self-comfort. I was thing to make a beautiful aliason just to assure others that everything was fine. I wanted to remind us of our simplest hope from the very beginning, that we are all just grown µ bids, but still kids.

Artist Bio

In February 2018 he premiered A Million Milles Away at Talward's colobrated National Thouter. His latest work, first, premiered at the National Talchung Theater an the National Theater in Taiple in June 2023.
