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URAL INDUSTRIAL BIENNIAL OF CONTEMPORARY ART

The Ural Industrial biennial of contemporary art is one of the biggest Russian regional projects in the field of contemporary art with international participation, organized and held by the Ural Branch of the National Centre for Contemporary Arts (NCCA-ROSIZO) in Ekaterinburg and the Ural region since 2010.

Uniqueness of the Ural Industrial biennial is defined by specifics of the region itself and its industrial heritage. The Biennial offers a new vector of the area development by utilizing contemporary art as a relevant resource. New meanings arise at the intersection of contemporary culture and local specifics, involving the region in the cultural context. The Biennial is a unique event not only in its concept and scale but also in cooperation with business community, functioning industrial enterprises, key cultural institutions and large companies of the Urals.

Industrialness defines the uniqueness of the project.

Since 2010, the Biennial does:

- revitalize abandoned industrial sites;
- explore new means of artistic and cultural production;
- research notion of labor in post-industrial society;
- run historical research projects about the industrial part of the Ural;
- · replicate its practices and make it accessible for other cultural institutions in the Ural region.

STRUCTURE

- Main project the key exhibition, occupying an abandoned industrial site.
- Artist-in-residence program intertwines artistic and industrial practices: international artists
 visit operating plants and factories of the Ural and, during their stay, create site-specific
 projects, to which the team launches guided bus tours, starting in early summer.
- Performance platform conceive new theatrical formants and create performances for nontheatrical spaces.
- Intellectual platform serves as the discussion platform for the issues, raised by the main project, and invites the public to get acquainted with important strands of thought.
- Educational program ongoing participatory project focused on art-mediation, storytelling practices and new ways of audience involvement along with traditional formats.
