Liu Zi-Ping received his PhD degree in 2018 from National Taiwan Normal University. He is an assistant professor in Fine Arts Department at National Taichung University of Education. He obtained important awards such as the National Taiwan Museum of Fine Arts Young Artist Collection, 2015; the Ministry of Culture Art Bank Collection, 2021; the First Prize of the Union Bank Young Artist Award, 2011, and the First Prize of the Paris Foundation Art Award, 2011. Liu's work is concerned with the connection and interaction between contemporary art and Taiwan's marine culture. Liu continually tries to identify the contemporary Taiwanese art as a field of cultural hybridity in which new thoughts, experiences and feelings can arise.

The exhibition "Icon of Light" in Hungate Medieval Art Centre (2024) tries to create the cross-cultural experiences of visual culture when viewers look at Taiwan's Mazu and Guanyin (Bodhisattva) and English icons of the Virgin Mary, St. Apollonia as well as angels. This show approaches the symbolic concept of "light" as medium to build a dialogue of religious iconography between Britain and Taiwan.
