ASIAN PRODUCERS' PLATFORM

The Asian Producers' Platform (APP) is a long term public-private partnership initiative. Initiated in 2014, the Platform has brought together over 45 Asian creative producers through a series of intensive APP camps. APP members have visited Seoul (2014), Taipei (2015), Tokyo (2016) and Melbourne (2017), researching the local arts and cultural scenes, cultural policy and the landscape artists work within. Members have conducted in depth research, created projects together, supported each others professional practices and developed their own networks across the region. After the successful initial 4 years the APP Platform now grows the network towards South East Asia and other Asian regions with the 2018 APP Camp held in Indonesia.

APP CAMP 2018 The APP camps are designed to create a strong network of Asian producers who can work effectively across the region, sharing and developing artistic works, skills and cultural practices.

Attendance is by application and the selection criteria includes a commitment to developing inter- cultural producing practice. APP CAMP incorporates a mix of emerging and established producers, in recognition that established producers still need support to develop inter-cultural practice.

The Asian Producers' Platform (APP) offers participants the opportunity to:

- Research and explore local contexts in Asia
- Develop an Inter-cultural practice
- · Explore producing as a creative practice

Over the course of the intensive 7 days APP CAMP, the participants will spend time:

- Getting to know each other including developing an appreciation of each other's language and cultural perspectives around producing.
- Get to know the host country's cultural and political contexts, cultural policy, funding climate, key players in the arts, key venues and the kind of work being produced, or for which there is audience demand.
- Research and explore approaches to creative producing within an Asian framework.
