

Movement: To Observe and I See are two pieces from the play Listen: City Memories. Mojo Woo and Cia Himiân Lí, sound designers of this play, are presenting them. This play applied the concepts of soundscape and strategies from oral history theatre. It collected personal histories and sensory memories from the performers and local residents, and composed them into various movements. The 1st piece puts a story about a 46-lives-taking fire accident with witnesses' narratives, body movements and sound effects. The 2nd piece draws the feeling of sounds where people might experience during the phase when losing their sight.
