Welcome to the **Debbie Allen Dance Academy**

Whether you are 14 years old and already passionate about dance, 5 years old and excited about pink leotards, 10 years old and just want to give dance a try, or 35 years old and looking for something fun and creative to do, the Debbie Allen Dance Academy has something for you!...

The Early Bird Program is designed for little ones ages 4 to 7 years old that are new to dance. With a 4-class minimum weekly requirement, the program introduces these young dancers to Ballet, Tap, African, Hip Hop, Jazz, and Flamenco. Emphasis is placed on learning in a structured dance environment, developing friendships and having fun. Early Birds perform in the recitals and participate in their own summer program which culminates in a special presentation for family and friends.

The RedBird Program, under the direction of Ms. Debbie Allen and Dean Bronwyn Thomas, is the next step for the most advanced group from the Early Bird program before the Academy level. With a 6 class weekly requirement, the RedBird program focuses on Modern and Ballet Techniques as well a an hour dedicated to Tap. Students are recommended for this level based on their skills by Ms. Bronwyn Thomas, Ms Allen and Mr. Williams. Monday and Wednesday classes are required with electives on Saturday.

The Pre-Academy Program levels 1 & 2, is tailored for students ages 8-18 years old who are either just being introduced to dance, or who have had previous instruction and are ready to build their skill level towards more serious training. A minimum of 4 classes weekly is required. The disciplines offered are Ballet, Tap, Modern, African, Jazz, Hip Hop, and Flamenco. Pre-Academy students perform in recitals and are encouraged to audition for the Summer Intensive program and all DADA productions.

The **Academy Program** with *Advanced, Intermediate, and Beginning* levels, is the intense professional training program that offers a comprehensive course of study for the serious dedicated student beginning at 8 years old. It is required that students take a minimum of 12 classes weekly in the disciplines of Ballet, African, Modern, Flamenco, Character, Tap, Jazz, Hip Hop, Dunham technique & Aerial Training. Voice and Acting classes are also offered for interested students. Academy Students perform in the recitals and are encouraged to audition for the Summer Intensive program and all DADA productions.

The Open Class Program gives those new to dance or those returning to dance a positive and exciting experience. Our Open Class Program is taught by our professional team of instructors in Ballet, Jazz, Tap, Modern, African, & Hip Hop.

HISTORY OF THE L.A. TAP FESTIVAL



The Debbie Allen Dance Academy's 1st Annual Los Angeles Tap Festival, held in August 2003, was embraced by the Tap Dance community and especially by Gregory Hines. who had generously offered to teach and perform in the festival. Just before the start of the festival, the tragic news of Gregory Hines' death was felt heavily in our hearts, but the festival went on in his memory. Our festival faculty and International students carried his spirit, and the week was filled with more inspiration, purpose, and commitment to the preservation of his great legacy and the art of Tap Dancing, A few years ago, we lost the legendary Dr. Fayard Nicholas, supporter of the LA Tap Festival and the Debbie Allen Dance Academy since their inceptions. but we continue to expand the language of Tap Dance by gathering these wonderful artists and students. Thank you for joining us. The journey continues...

LA TAP FEST FACULTY



Debbie Allen continues to be one of the most respected, relevant, and versatile talents in the entertainment industry today and is an internationally recognized director, choreographer and author. As Culture Connect Ambassador, Ms. Allen represented the U.S. in visits to Brazil, China, Italy, and India expanding the opportunities in arts education for young people all over the world. She is a board member of the American Film Institute, an Executive Committee member of UCLA's School of Theatre, Film, and Television, and served as a member of the prestigious President's Committee on the Arts and Humanities under President George W. Bush.

Debbie Allen has received three Emmy awards honoring her choreography, and two Emmys and one Golden Globe for her role as "Lydia Grant" in the hit series, Fame. She then forayed from acting to directing - first with the series "Fame," followed by "Family Ties" and "Bronx Zoo," before taking the reins at NBC's "A Different World" as director and producer

in 1988. Since then, she has accumulated a long list of directing and producing credits for television, including The Fresh Prince of Bel Air, The Parkers, That's So Raven, All of us, Girlfriends, Everybody Hates Chris, Hellcats and Grey's Anatomy. She produced the Steven Spielberg epic film Amistad in 1997. Allen has choreographed for artists such as Michael Jackson, Mariah Carey, and Janet Jackson, and also holds the distinction of having choreographed the Academy Awards a total of ten times, six in consecutive years. Allen also has staged musicals that played to standing room only crowds for the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. where she has been Artist in Residence for over ten years.

In March 2008, Debbie Allen made her critically acclaimed Broadway directorial debut with the premiere of an all African American production of Tennessee William's classic, Cat On A Hot Tin Roof, which starred James Earl Jones, Phylicia Rashad, Terrence Howard, Anika Noni Rose, and Giancarlo Esposito.

Ms. Allen recently mounted a new musical adaptation of Oliver Twist called Twist at the Pasadena Playhouse. The show played to sold-out audiences and cheering crowds, and was voted as the Favorite Show of season by the Friends of the Pasadena Playhouse.

Daughter of Vivian Ayers and Dr. Andrew A. Allen, wife of NBA All Star Norman Nixon, mother of Vivian Nichole and Thump, sister of Tex, Phylicia and Hugh, Ms. Allen devotes most of her life's work to the development and inspiration of young people in the Arts.



DIRECTOR

Jason Samuels Smith (performer, choreographer, director) has emerged as a multi-talented leader in the Art form of Tap. He received a Dance Magazine Award as well as an Emmy and American Choreography Award for "Outstanding Choreography" for the Opening number of the Jerry Lewis/MDA Telethon. Mr. Samuels-Smith has also received the Gregory Hines Humanitarian Award; Certificate of Appreciation by the City of Los Angeles for creating the First Annual Los Angeles Tap Festival in 2003; a Proclamation declaring April

23rd "Jason Samuels Day" from the City of Shreveport, Louisiana; the "Ivy of Education" from Brainerd Institute; the "President Kenny Award" from Stony Brook; an Alpert/McDowell Residency Award; an Arts International Grant; National Performance Network and Map funding among others in support of his work.

Choreography and performances include Mya on CBS's Secret Talents of the Stars, twice as a special quest (soloist & company appearance) on Fox's hit series "So You Think You Can Dance", and Dancing with The Stars to name a few, Other television and film credits include co-starring in Dean Hargrove's award-winning short film "Tap Heat": Outkast's feature film "Idlewild"; and Debbie Allen's AMC series "Cool Women". Performances include Sammy (tribute to Sammy Davis jr.); Soul Possessed (leading role); Tony Award winning Broadway show Bring in Da'Noise, Bring in Da'Funk (principal and lead roles); and Imagine Tap! (leading role). Mr. Samuels Smith continues

to tour the world with his own tap company A.C.G.I (Anybody Can Get It), India Jazz Suites co-starring with Kathak Master Pandit Chitresh Das, YouthSpeaks, JaJa Productions Band, and Charlie's Angels: A Tribute to Charlie Parker.

As a humanitarian, his work has supported organizations such as Dancers Responding to Aids, Tied to Greatness, Career Transitions for Dancers and Tap Into A Cure, and has helped to develop Tap Dreams. a worldwide documentary/global exchange which auditions young tap dancers in other countries and offers scholarships to attend the most popular tap festivals within the US. He is also one of the only tap dancers to fully design, develop, and promote the Jason Samuels Smith professional tap dance shoe produced and sold exclusively by BLOCH. Mr. Samuels Smith aims to promote respect for the art form and create opportunities for tap dancers, as he continues to provide leadership as a spokesman for tap around the world.




Inspired and mentored by Debbie Allen, Chloe Arnold hopes to also inspire and unite people globally through the Arts. An internationally recognized Performer and

Choreographer, Ms. Arnold graduated with a degree in Film from Columbia University. Throughout her career, she has had extensive experience in multiple aspects of the industry, as Co-director of

B'JON Carter-Burnell

B'Jon began tap dancing with Jason Samuels-Smith and Chloe Arnold at age 11. B'Jon has also had the blessing to study with Ardie Bryant and Ms. Arlene Kennedy. He was a member of the Kennedy Tap Company founded by Ms. Kennedy, with her brother Paul Kennedy. With KTC, B'Jon has performed throughout the United States and Canada. His credits include the Jaguar Tribute to Style, NAACP Vision Awards, Thalians 51st Anniversary, Jerry Lewis MDA Telethon, Urbana, and Herbie Hancock Tribute Show. B'Jon is currently an undergraduate at the University of California. Los Angeles.



STAR DIXON

Starinah Dixon, a.k.a. Star, was born and raised in Chicago. She started dancing at a very young age. Brought up into a dancing family including her mom who studied African dance, which she later also studied, it was no doubt that she would have a love for dance. She is the younger sister of Bril Barrett who started M.A.D.D. Rhythms where she is one of the original members of the 9-year running tap company. With M.A.D.D. Rhythms, she has performed all over the U.S. including The L.A. Tap Festival, The St. Louis Tap Festival, The Detroit Tap Festival, and Northern Illinois University. As well as performing, she also teaches and has been since the age of 16. Her teaching experience includes Alyo Children's dance theater, Najwa, Chicago Park District, The Imani Dance Center, and the M.A.D.D. Rhythms Tap Academy. She, also dances with Chicago's newest hip-hop company, Purified.



Martin "Tre" Dumas III is a tap dancer and choreographer from Chicago, IL. Mr. Dumas received his early dance training and his first teaching experience at Tommy Sutton's Mayfair Academy of Fine Arts. He graduated from Clark Atlanta University and in 1995 had his first tap festival teaching experience at the Chicago Human Rhythm Project, representing Mayfair and Mr. Sutton's legacy. Later, as Steppin' Out, Mr. Dumas and Bril Barrett performed and taught at the St. Louis Tap Festival, Detroit Tap Festival, and performed at The Democratic National Convention. In January 2001, Dumas and Barrett created the internationally renowned company, M.A.D.D. Rhythms and co-founded the M.A.D.D. Rhythms Tap Academy later that year. Together they have trained a crew of young dancers who are all beginning to make their own marks. In 2005, Mr. Dumas (along with Bril Barrett and Lisa LaTouche) co-founded The Chicago Tap Summit. Recently, he became the newest "extended member" of Jason Samuels Smith's ACGI. Mr. Dumas taught and performed throughout the U.S.,

Canada, Europe, and South America. Credits include: Daddy Bates in a national touring revival of Broadway's The Tap Dance Kid, North American, and European tours of Riverdance, and Derick Grant's Imagine Tap (2006).



Kara Mack choreographer of Balandugu Kan Dance Troupe, has studied many styles of African dance from Master Dancers all over the Diaspora. She has had the honor of performing for the NAACP, BET, and Billboard Awards because of African dance. In honor of the spirit of Africa, she passes on the wisdom, purity, and strength of African dance.




Kevin Harris At 7 years old, Kevin Harris began touring the nation with a Hip Hop company called Rhythm Nation. Years later, in 2001, Kevin was part of the inaugural class that opened the Debbie Allen Dance Academy (DADA), participating in establishing a standard of excellence for those students who followed. Ms. Debbie Allen fast-embraced Kevin and has utilized his dancing and choreographic skills in all of her professional productions since 2001. By his third year of study, Ms. Allen hired him to teach Hip Hop at the Academy and his choreography has been performed in every Academy Concert since. In 2005 and 2006 he accompanied Ms. Allen to South Carolina to teach Master Hip Hop Classes as part of her "Open Fields" master class program and was Assistant Choreographer for her 2006 production "Bayou Legend and in 2007s "Alex in Wonderland." Also in 2007 Kevin was hired as the dance talent coordinator for Stan Lathan's HBO hit, "Def Comedy Jam," choreographed for the hit show "Everybody Hates Chris," and the "Tribute to Herbie Hancock" receiving a outstanding review in the L.A. Times. In 2009 Ms.Allen

recruited Kevin as Assistant Choreographer for the "Brothers of the Knight" tour in South Carolina, Louisiana and finally in Los Angeles. Later, she hired him as Assistant Director for her 2009 production of "Dreams." For the last 5 years Kevin Harris has taught in DADA Summer Intensives and for three years in the Summer Intensives offered at Stage Presence in Houston, Texas. Besides teaching at the Debbie Allen Dance Academy, Kevin has taught Hip Hop classes in the Los Angeles Unified School District, for the after-school program, L.A.'s Best and P.S. Arts. Since September, 2006, Kevin toured all over the U.S., Europe, Asia and South America with Fergie, as well as appearing on Jay Leno, Tyra Banks, MTV, Nickelodeon, Pepsi's Super Bowl Smash, and the VH1 and Billboard awards shows, as well as performing with Nelly Furtado. Kevin has also been a featured concert performer for choreographers Dave Scott, Chuck Maldonado, Fatima, and Lizette & Shonique.



Chantel Heath Is working her way through the world as a dancer and choreographer. She is trained in genres ranging from tap, hip hop, jazz and modern, to swing and martial arts. She has worked with such artists as Tupac, Busta Rhymes, LL Cool J, Savion Glover (Cannes Film Festival, Jerry Lewis Telethon) and Michael Jackson for his 45th Anniversary. As a member of the Kennedy Tap Company she danced in Cuba with Alicia Alonzo's "International Ballet of Cuba," and was one of the first African Americans to dance at the Kremlin in Russia. Her most recent film credits are Idlewild and Tap Heat and her choreography was featured in the 2008 season finale of So You Think You Can Dance.



Born in Pasadena, California, Arthur Duncan entered Pasadena City College to study pharmacy, but left school to pursue a career in show business. He toured with the Jimmy Rodgers Show, and had his own television variety show in Australia. After years of appearances in Europe, Duncan was "discovered" by Lawrence Welk's personal manager, Sam Lutz. After appearing as a guest on the show, Welk offered Duncan a permanent spot on his weekly show where he usually had one tap solo and performed in a trio.

Duncan's unique position as the only African-American performer on the show created somewhat awkward moments. In an era when blacks and whites did not hold hands or even kiss each other on television shows the large, all cast production numbers which often showed various white male and female performers holding hands and dancing, Arthur Duncan is often seen standing in the background, trying very hard to not look like he is "with" any of the women. Later, when racial taboos had eased, Duncan did perform choral dance numbers with Mary Lou

Metzger and Anacani. Since the end of the Welk Show, Duncan has appeared in several television shows, and in the tap dancing movie "Tap".

Cathie is the younger granddaughter of Fayard Nicholas, of the legendary Nicholas Brothers Tap duo that thrilled audiences and performed in over 30 major movies. She currently teaches for Debbie Allen Dance Academy, Universal Dance Designs and Los Angeles Unified School District's Youth Development Program. Her performances with the Nicholas Brothers included Carnegie Hall, Hollywood Palladium, San Francisco Jazz Festival, Duke University and numerous Tap Festivals. With her grandfather, Fayard Nicholas and her sister Nicole, as the Nicholas Sisters, she performed at Jazz at Drew, Stanford University, Professional Dancers Society, Santa Monica College and many other venues. While a student at Debbie Allen Dance Academy her performances included musicals Brothers of the Knight and Pepito's Story, Steve Harvey's Summer Jam, and in Las Vegas at the Debbie Reynolds Revue. She has assisted in a Master Class at the LA Tap Festival since its inception. With Universal Dance Designs (Paul & Arlene Kennedy, founders), she studied for over 15 years and has been featured with the Kennedy

Tap Company and performed throughout Cuba as guests of the International Dance Festival and extensively in Los Angeles for over a decade. Her dance talents have been displayed in Madrid, Paris, Canada, and most US states. She has choreographed numerous routines including Tribute to Debbie Reynolds and Ivory Wheeler, Chocolate Nutcracker produced by Wayne Bascomb, Chester Whitmore's Swing Band and Orchestra, and Capital recording artist, AKsent. This year The Nicholas Sisters are featured performers at the Philly Tap Festival in Pennsylvania. Cathie was a Sparkid for the WNBA Sparks Women's Basketball team performing extensive hip-hop routines at the Staples Center for Sparks basketball games and special appearances from 2003-2005. Her other screen credits include That's So Raven, Dance With Me, Jack The Bear, Lassie, the Vickie Lawrence Show, Toys R Us commercial, Se Habla Everything at the Los Angeles Theater, and a video with the late Tupac Shakur.



Greg Poland holds a BFA cum-laude in musical theater from Point Park College. Greg appeared in the National tour and Los Angeles co. of THE PRODUCERS w/ Jason Alexander and Martin Short. Greg was assistant choreographer/cast for LIKE JAZZ at the Mark Taper Forum. He was featured on Broadway & the European tour of the Tony award winning show BLACK & BLUE w/ Savion Glover and starred in Lincoln Centers' DREAMS ON A SHOESTRING. Some of his regional and touring credits include: THE HOT MIKADO, MS. 

Sue Samuels (Teacher, Choreographer, Performer) has established herself as one of the staples of the performing arts community of today. With over 35 years of experience, her expertise is often sought after for mentoring and coaching purposes by professionals and aspiring artists from around the world. Her students have included numerous stage, film and tv stars including Melba Moore, Brooke Shields, and Irene Cara. Performance and choreographic credits include lead dancer and assistant choreographer in such shows as Got Tu Go Disco at the Minskoff Theater on Broadway, The Johnny Hallyday Show in Paris, The Brazil Export Show in Rio de Janeiro to name a few. Aaron Williams is a performer, teacher, composer, percussionist, keyboardist, vocalist, drummer, and tap dancer. He received his B.A. from MWSU and pursued a Master of Music degree at CSU, Long Beach.

Dormeshia Sumbry-Edwards (Performer/Choreographer/Instructor) started tapping at age 3 as a student of the Kennedys in CA, going on to perform in Rome at the Tip Tap Festival at age 8. At age 12 came her Broadway debut in Black and Blue. Dormeshia's Broadway credits include the Tony Award Winning Bring In Da'Noise, Bring In Da'Funk. Dormeshia has toured nationally with Wild Woman Blues and appeared with The Jazz Tap Ensemble. Dormeshia was dance captain, principal dancer, and understudy to the lead role in the International Tour of Bring in Da'Noise, Bring in Da'Funk. She's been a special guest artist for the Harlem Jazz Dance Festivals where she performed a tribute to Dr. James "Buster" Brown and served as judge for their Annual Hoofers Challenge Cutting Contest. Film credits include "TAP", "Bamboozled" (for which she was also Assistant Choreographer), and "The Rodgers and Hart Story: Thou Swell, Thou Witty". Her choreography has been featured in the off-Broadway show TAAP, for the all-female tap quartet R.I.F.F., and in Michael Jackson's music video "Rock Your World". She was featured in

a Debbie Allen's workshop of the musical SAMMY. Dormeshia has taught for tap festivals in NYC, LA, and Brazil, Columbus Taps, and K-Broadway in Tokyo. Dormeshia was made Tap Advisor for Dance Magazine and the official Tap Spokesperson for Capezio.



A native of Manchester, New Hampshire, Aaron Tolson continues to make his mark by championing the movement of the art form of Tap in several arenas. Mr. Tolson is a national spokesperson for dance wear company SoDanca, a consultant and writer for Dance Spirit Magazine, former professor of dance at Plymouth State University and the Boston Conservatory, as well as the assistant choreographer, co-creator and assistant producer of the acclaimed stage production Imagine Tap! Aaron started dancing at the age of ten in Lawrence, Massachusetts. Four years into his dance career he was performing in the Great Tap Reunion at the Apollo Theatre. He attended St. John's University obtaining a Bachelor of Science degree in Communications all the while honing his tap technique in Manhattan. His senior year of college landed him in the New York Shakespeare Festival tap program, also known as Funk U! Soon Aaron became a company member of Manhattan Tap and worked with the show Tap Dogs. Jumping feet first into choreography, he landed a job with Absolut with a tour called Absolut Tap! In 2005. Aaron completed a six-year

run with Riverdance, the internationally acclaimed show with performances on Broadway and Radio City Music Hall where he was a featured soloist and dance captain. Since then, Aaron has performed and taught at numerous tap festivals, in addition to performing with Brookline Chorus' Duke Ellington Sacred Concert, The Late Late Show with Liam O'Conner in Ireland and on Globo TV representing the Brazil International Tap Festival. Most recently, Aaron was featured on Dance.com and has choreographed, produced and directed Something to Tap About and Tapped and Tapped In - featuring New England Tap Ensemble. Aaron formed New England Tap Ensemble in May of 2007 to promote the art of tap in the community while fostering a sense of individuality in a professional artist.



Dianne 'Lady Di' Walker, a pioneer in tap dancing's resurgence has a 30 year career spanning Broadway, Television, Film and International Jazz Dance Concerts and Festivals. United States Artists selected Walker as the recipient of the USA Rose Fellow 2008, Dance. Ms. Walker holds a Master's degree in Education, and has taught at Harvard, Williams College, University of Michigan, UCLA, Bates, and Wesleyan. She received Oklahoma City University's 1998 Living Treasure In American Dance Award, adding to a long line of awards and lifetime tributes. She began her dance training in Boston with Mildred Kennedy-Bradic and later, Leon Collins, Jimmy "Sir Slyde" Mitchell and Jimmy Slyde. Leon Collins passed away in 1985, leaving Dianne to continue as one of the Directors of his school. She continues to share this rich legacy with her students.

Melinda Sullivan (Tap Dancer, Actress, Musician) recently appeared as one of the Top 11 Finalists on FOX's So You Think You Can Dance, Season 7. Prior to returning home to California, Melinda held a recurring role as the mysterious Zoe Finn on CBS's As The World Turns. She has toured as an original cast member of the onstage Disney's High School Musical and High School Musical Two, both directed by Jeff Calhoun. Other theatre credits include: The 25th Anniversary Tour of Cats, Frank Wildhorn's Wonderland, Thank You, Gregory, and numerous Town Hall Broadway By the Year performances in New York City as a soloist and choreographer. Ivery Wheeler brings a lifetime of experience with every shuffle and tap step. He began his tap dancing career at the age of 3 dancing on the bar at the Louisiana Club in Las Vegas more than 50 years ago. The history, grace, style and skill this one man possesses can easily fill a stage and any room. At age 14, Ivery met Maceo Anderson of "The Four Step Brothers". In short order young Ivery become a hoofer performing in Anderson's groups, "Four Steps and a Miss" and later "The Third Generation Steps". For more than ten years "Anderson's kids" were on everyone's short list. They performed with Jerry Lewis, Merv Griffin, Mike Douglas, Dinah Shore, Pearl Bailey, Dean Martin Sammy Davis Jr., Frank Sinatra, Bob Hope, Lucille Ball, Donald O'Connor, Engelbert Humperdinck, Gregory Hines, Henry LeTang, Juliet Prowse, Dr. Jimmy Slyde, Debbie Reynolds, and many others. Publicly acknowledged by Savion Glover, and Dormeshia Sumbry Edwards as their mentor, teacher and friend; and by Dianne Walker as partner, and confidante, this humble

legend is just as comfortable teaching in the studio as performing on stage. With such monumental performances as "The Cotton Club", & the Tony award winning "Black and Blue" in Paris, and on Broadway, Ivery can do it all: sing, dance, act. Honored at the L.A. Tap Festival in 2008 this legend is following in Maceo Anderson's foot steps and building the next generation of tappers.



Steve was a featured soloist in the Jazz Tap Ensemble, a member of Rhapsody In Taps, an artist in residence at the Chicago Human Rhythm Project, and an original cast member of Hot Shoe Shuffle. He has performed and taught across the US, Canada, Brazil, France and Germany. Steve's choreography was featured at the Beijing International Dance Festival. He trained Kiril Kulish for the Broadway production of Billy Elliot for which Kiril won the Tony Award and has served as tap coach for pop icons. Steve edited the Oral History/Biography of Stan Kahn and the Oral History/Biography of Robert Scheerer and has made five instructional tap videos. Steve trained at UCLA, the Sorbonne/Universite de Paris III and the Piccolo Teatro di Milano. Steve also provided sounds for the tap dancing Hershey's Kisses on TV.

Steve is currently performing at the M Bar in Hollywood and is on faculty at CSU Long Beach and Santa Monica College. He teaches weekly at the Tap Academy in Santa Monica, the Dance Arts Academy in LA and the Gabriella Axelrad Education

Foundation in LA. He is the director of the nonprofit arts organization LA Ironworks and is on the Board of the Dance Resource Center.




