Taiwan's total land area is only about 3,6000 square kilometers; it is shaped like a tobacco leaf that is narrow at both ends. It lies off the southeastern coast of mainland Asia, across the Tair Straits from Mainland China-- a solitary isla in the western edge of the Pacific Ocean. To orth lies Japan and Okinawa, to the south is the Philippines. Many airlines fly to Taiwan, helping make it the perfect travel destination.

Taiwan lies on the western edge of the Pacific "rim of fire," and continuous tectonic movements have created majestic peaks, rolling hills and

rim of fire," and continuous tectonic movements have created majestic peaks, rolling hills and plains, basins, coastlines, and other wonders. Taiwan sees climates of many types: tropical, Sub-tropical, and temperate, providing clear differentiation between the different seasons. There are about 18,400 species of wildlife on the island, with more than 20% belonging to rare or endangered species; among these are the landlocked salmon, Taiwan mountain goat, Formosan rock monkey, Formosan black bear, blue magpie, Mikado pheasant, Hsuehshan grass lizard, and many more.

The government has established 6 national parks and 13 national scenic areas to preserve Tawan's best natural ecological environment and cultural sites. Take in the splendor and sheer heights of the cliffs at Taroko Gorge; take a ride on the Affshan train--one of only three mountain rails as in the world--and experience the broaking sunset and sea of clouds; hike up to mit of Northeast Asia's highest peak, Jade Moul, ain. You can also soak up the sun in Kending, Asia's version of Hawaii; stand at the edge of Sun Moon Lake; traipse through the East Rift Valley; or visit the offshore islands of Kinmen and Penghu. It's fun in capital letters as well as an awesome journey of natural discovery!

The cultural aspects also not to be missed. The blending of Hakka, Taiwanese, and mainland Chinese cultures has produced a rich plethora of cultural and social color. Whether it is religion, architecture, language, living habits, or food, it's just one big exciting melting pot! Food is the best representative of this cultural mixing and matching. Aside from cuisines from different parts of the mainland such as Zhejiang, Hunan, Guangdong, Yunnan, Shanghai, Beijing, Sichuan, and others, there is also the local Taiwanese cuisine as well as the local delicacies of each area.

The Troupe

The Chinese Arts Dance Ensemble is the pride of Chinese folk dance, a dance troupe of world-class professionalism, creativity and skill. Since our ensemble was established, we have tried to ensure the continuation of traditional Chinese folk dance through regular performances and working with schools and communities actively. Our Ensemble has introduced youth of Taiwan to the ancient gentility of Chinese classical dance and the excitement of folk dance. By bringing the world of classical and folk dance to our communities, we not only give our children an outlet for their intense creativity, but also promote the perpetuation of these art forms.

Our Ensemble was the first art performing team of Taiwan to combine dance, gymnastics, and professional concept, which was established in 1984. Our team members follow a serious professional training system. Each member is required to learn all kinds of dance training, such as the skill of Chinese folk dance, musical rhythm, ballet, body movement, gymnastics, jazz and Kung-Fu...etc. After many years of training, the members are taught to combine all skills as each single item is learned

The dance company chairperson, Miss Wang Hsiang-Chin, holds formal qualification in performing arts and has extensive experience in teaching. For many years, she has done research Into Chinese classical Dance. As very little has been achieved in the incorporation of folk dance into modern teaching techniques, she is particularly keen on the promotion of minority dance forms, in the hope that will elevate Taiwanese art onto higher ground. After years of endless pursuit and cultivation, this dance company has developed a style of its own and refined the art of dancing. In addition to its regular showcases, it has also participated and earned wide acclaims at national dance contests.

Our participation in this festival is an opportunity to expose a unique gathering of the world's foremost dancers and dance experts to the beauty of Chinese dance traditions. It is our deepest hope that our performance will do justice to these traditions and give audiences a deeper appreciation of Chinese culture.
