Note -

"Tian Gong" in Hakka refers to heaven, and also denotes the divine or celestial beings (specifically the Jade Emperor). Early Hakka people were hardworking; both men and women worked outside the home solely to provide for their families. It wouldn't be an exaggeration to say they relied on "Tian Gong" for their livelihood.

In creating this piece, from the perspective of Hakka descendants, it depicts the reverence and gratitude early Hakka people had towards "Tian Gong." The composition is divided into two sections: the first describes the ceremonial reverence towards "Tian Gong," while the second reflects the devout prayers of the people seeking peace and safety from "Tian Gong."
